

P.E and Sports Premium Funding report for Newton Primary School



2019-2020

Newton Primary School will receive a £16,000 (and £10 for each child on role from Year 1 – Year 6) in Sports Premium funding from the Government this year. This is to ensure high quality PE and sport provision throughout school. Total Sport Premium allocation: £17,360

Payment is allocated in two instalments throughout year, the first being on the 1st November 2019 and the second instalment on 1st May 2020. The plan will be reviewed prior to the May instalment, for additional budgeting.
